The 2025 annual Bird Town report has been completed and we hope to continue to be a Gold Level Bird Town by earning over 25 points for completing bird friendly activities covering five different categories. For 2026, we would like to pursue some new Bird Town goals, such as educating the community about the importance of keeping cats indoors and outdoor lights off during migration periods. The Great Backyard Bird Count will be Feb. 13-16, and Lynnette will be giving talks at the UMFP Library on Feb. 10th at 11:00 am and 3:30pm about how to participate.

We have tentatively scheduled an invasives cleanup at Veteran's Park for Sunday, May 17th 10:30am.
