Public Health & Safety Committee Meeting

Public Health & Safety Committee Members: Commissioner and Committee Chair Charles M. Whiting, Commissioner Kip McFatrige, Commissioner Nicolas O. Scull; Andrew J. Block, Chief of Police; Edward Glassman, Fire Chief; Kenneth E. Davidson, Assistant Chief Operations & Administration - Second Alarmer's Rescue Squad

- I. **Call to order:** Commissioner and Committee Chair Charles M. Whiting called the meeting to order following adjournment of the Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting.
- II. **Roll Call:** Commissioner and Committee Chair Whiting; Commissioners McFatrige and Scull; Police Chief Block; Fire Chief Glassman; Assistant Chief Davidson. Also present were: Randall Schaible, Assistant Township Manager/Director of Finance; Matthew H. Candland, Township Manager; Alex Baumler, Township Solicitor.
- III. **Approval of Minutes** - November 22, 2021 - The meeting minutes were unanimously approved as submitted.
- IV. **Announcements:**
Commissioner Whiting introduced Edward Glassman as the Township's new Fire Chief. Chief Glassman provided a brief background of his experiences and qualifications.
- V. **Acceptance and approval of the following monthly reports - December 2021:**
 - A. Police Department – Memorandum and Monthly Reports - Chief Block discussed the following:
 - Statistics from calls, crimes, offenses, arrests, investigations, citizen concerns and traffic. Community-oriented police activities were also reviewed.
 - Commissioner McFatrige thanked Chief Block for the detailed activities of the officers.
 - B. Department of Emergency Services - Chief Glassman reviewed the following:
 - Statistics of emergency responses, inspections, permits, activities and trainings for the month.
 - Safety tips on smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors.
 - C. Second Alarmer's Association and Rescue Squad - Chief Davidson reviewed the following:
 - Statistics of emergency responses, staffing and yearly comparisons.
 - Incentives offered by Willow Grove Charitable Fund to emergency responder personnel.
- VI. **Old Business:**
 - A. Police Department Accreditation - Separation from The Rodgers Group with a recommendation to engage Aspirant Consulting Group, LLC for accreditation services for the Upper Moreland Township Police Department:
 - Chief Block explained the rationale to continue the accreditation process with the current consultants who now work for the Aspirant Consulting Group, LLC.
 - The Committee recommends the Board of Commissioners take action at the February 7, 2022 Regular Meeting.

A. Liquefied Natural Gas Transport Resolution:

- The Committee shared concerns and potential consequences of transporting liquid natural gas through the Township.
- The Committee directed Mr. Baumler to draft a resolution.
- The Committee recommends the Board of Commissioners take action at the February 7, 2022 Regular Meeting.

B. Recommendation to amend the Upper Moreland Township Civil Service Rules regarding the hiring from entry level lists for police officers and firefighters:

- The Committee held a lengthy discussion on the proposed amendments to the Rules and next steps of the Civil Service Commission to review changes and provide their recommendation to the Board of Commissioners.

VIII. Other Items:

A. COVID-19 Update:

- Mr. Candland reported that Montgomery County has approximately 516,448 fully vaccinated and 137,000 partially vaccinated. In Upper Moreland Township, approximately 3,846 residents have been infected with COVID and there were 63 deaths, since the beginning of the pandemic.
- A mask mandate and social distancing continues for visitors in the Township Building.

The Upper Moreland Police Department responded to 1,247 calls for service for the month of January 2022. The total calls for service for year to date is 1,247.

The calls for service between December of 2021 and January of 2022 increased by 53 incidents. The monthly police department call volume remains with a 10% increase in call volume when comparing January 2021 and January 2022.

Outlying year-to-date call volume: January 2021; 1,107, January 2020; 1,228, January 2019; 1,168. Overall difference between year to date January 2019 and January 2022 is approximately a 6% increase in call volume.

The following is an overview of Part-One crime statistics:

- There have been no burglaries reported YTD. In 2021 and 2020 YTD no burglaries reported in 2019.
- Thefts, including retail theft, YTD are 33 with 25 clearances.
- There have been no Robbery offenses YTD, with three reported in January 2021 and two in 2020 for the same reporting period and one in 2019.
- All robberies remain under investigation by the Detective Bureau.

**Community Oriented Policing and Police Department Monthly
Activities and Highlights**

January 3, 2022 – Calvin Grasso was recognized by the Upper Moreland Township Board of Commissioners and State Representative Nancy Guent for his remarkable toy collection drive for underprivileged children in the greater Willow Grove Area. Sergeant Pam Cordura assisted Calvin with his initiatives through the months of November and December 2021.

January 5, 2022 – Valerie Panti posted on the Upper Moreland Community News that she was very grateful for the assistance she received from the Upper Moreland Police Department. Mrs. Panti's vehicle sustained a flat tire after striking a pothole in the 1100 block of Easton Road. Officer Amanda Rossetti responded and changed Mrs. Panti's tire. Mrs. Panti stated that she was very thankful as she canceled the roadside assistance due to Officer Rossetti's assistance. Mrs. Panti offered Starbucks gift cards to Officer Rossetti who respectfully declined and requested that Mrs. Panti pay it forward.

January 26, 2022 – In March 2020, Detective Frank Gallagher investigated a sexual assault of a township resident on Preston Lane. The investigation revealed that the perpetrator of this crime was the resident's former boyfriend. The investigation further revealed that he accessed the residence by climbing a ladder to the roof of the house and then climbed down to a balcony where he entered the residence. The perpetrator grabbed the resident and locked her in a bedroom. Despite her numerous attempts telling the perpetrator to leave the residence he sexually assaulted her and then left the residence. The perpetrator was subsequently arrested, charged, and convicted of this heinous crime. On January 26, 2022, Detective Gallagher testified at the sentencing of the perpetrator, Brian D. Kelly. Kelly was sentenced by Court of Common Pleas Judge Thomas C. Branca to 69 to 138 months in state prison. Detective Gallagher's investigation was pivotal in obtaining a conviction of Brian Kelly committing this sexual assault. This is clearly evident with sentencing imposed by Judge Branca and the concerns of the court with Kelly having predator tendencies. Again, through Detective Gallagher's investigation, our community is a safer place for the victim and residents of the township. Detective Gallagher is commended for his very thorough investigation resulting in this conviction.

January 28, 2022 – Sergeant Pam Cordura and K9 Officer Matt Snyder participated in the annual career day at Upper Moreland High School. Career day is sponsored by UMHS to provide students with information on various careers they may be interested in choosing. Officers provided information to students on entering the law enforcement field as a professional career. Requirements and qualifications are discussed with students with hope that some will select a career in the law enforcement.

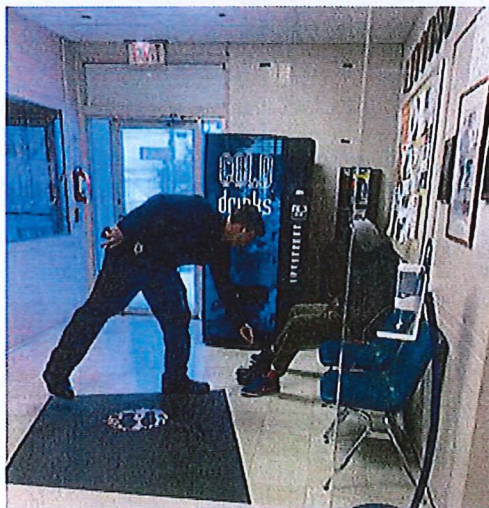
January 28, 2022 – Township resident Mr. Ronald Whetstone sent an email commending Officer Scott Metheny for his assistance at a recent accident he was involved in.
