Finance & Administrative Committee Members: Commissioner and Committee Chair Benjamin Olszewski, Commissioner Cheryl Lockard, Commissioner Demond Mullen. Township Staff Member: John D. Bates, Assistant Township Manager/Director of Finance

- II. **Pledge of Allegiance**
- III. **Call to Order:** Commissioner and Committee Chair Benjamin Olszewski called the meeting to order.
- IV. **Roll Call:** Commissioner and Committee Chair Olszewski, Commissioner Lockard, Commissioner Mullen and Mr. Bates, Assistant Township Manager/Director of Finance. Also present: Patrick T. Stasio, Township Manager, and Alex Baumler, Township Solicitor.
- V. **Announcements** – Nothing to report.
- VI. **Presentation:**
Brad Remig, PFM - Bond Issuance for Capital Projects:
 - Thanked Mr. Stasio for providing information to assist with creating a plan.
 - A three-step issue process and explained the first step issue for \$6 million in 2025.
 - Two bonds currently held by the Township are: \$7.4 million left on a 2021 bond and \$2.865 million on a 2022 bond. New financing is being structured in the approximate amount of \$30.2 million for projects over the next five years.
 - Reviewed principals, drop-offs, payments, projections and timeline for the \$6 million bond.
 - Bonds in 2026 and 2027 are conditional to potential building renovations and their estimates.
 - Commissioner Lockard noted that \$2.6 million in Township cash was collected from an increased amount of taxes in 2024 and fees are estimated at \$200K.
 - Commissioner McFatridge clarified that there is a \$0 tax increase to residents.
 - The Committee recommends the Board of Commissioners approve an ordinance at the June 2, 2025 Regular Meeting.

A. Proposed Resolution for DCED grant application for Blair Mill Road widening project:

- Additional funding to widen the right stack turn lane on Blair Mill Road heading northeast, turning south onto Route 611.
- The Township currently holds a grant in the amount of \$175,000. The project is estimated at a total of \$800,000. The Township is asking for a \$650,000 grant from the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) with no match; however, 10% is not covered for engineering.
- The Committee recommends the Board of Commissioners approve a resolution at the June 2, 2025 Regular Meeting.

XIV. Other Items:

- Commissioner Lockard proposed to provide support to the State for additional SEPTA funding. There are plans to eliminate and reduce bus and rail transportation services and significantly increase fares, which will affect residents and businesses.

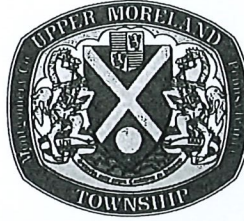

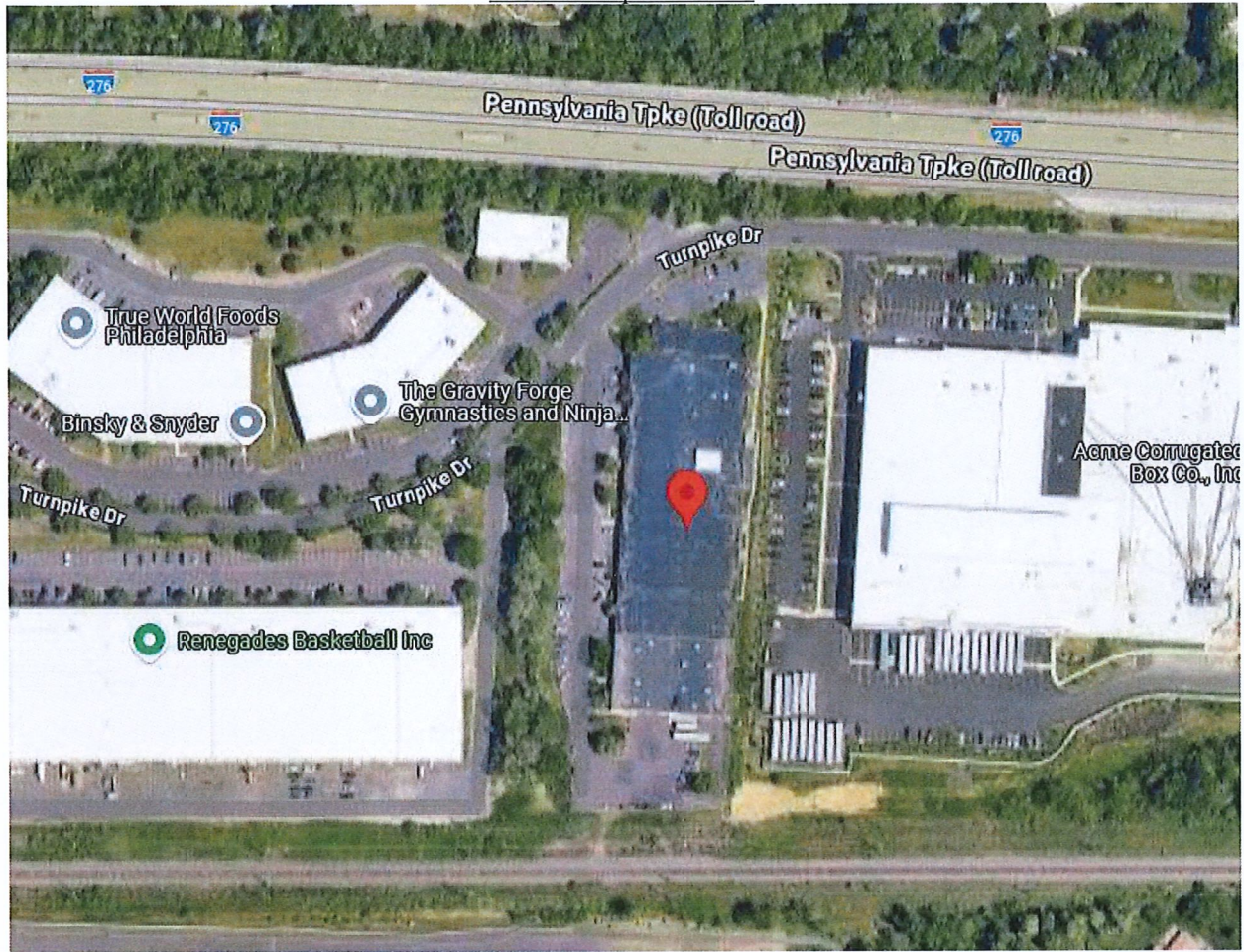

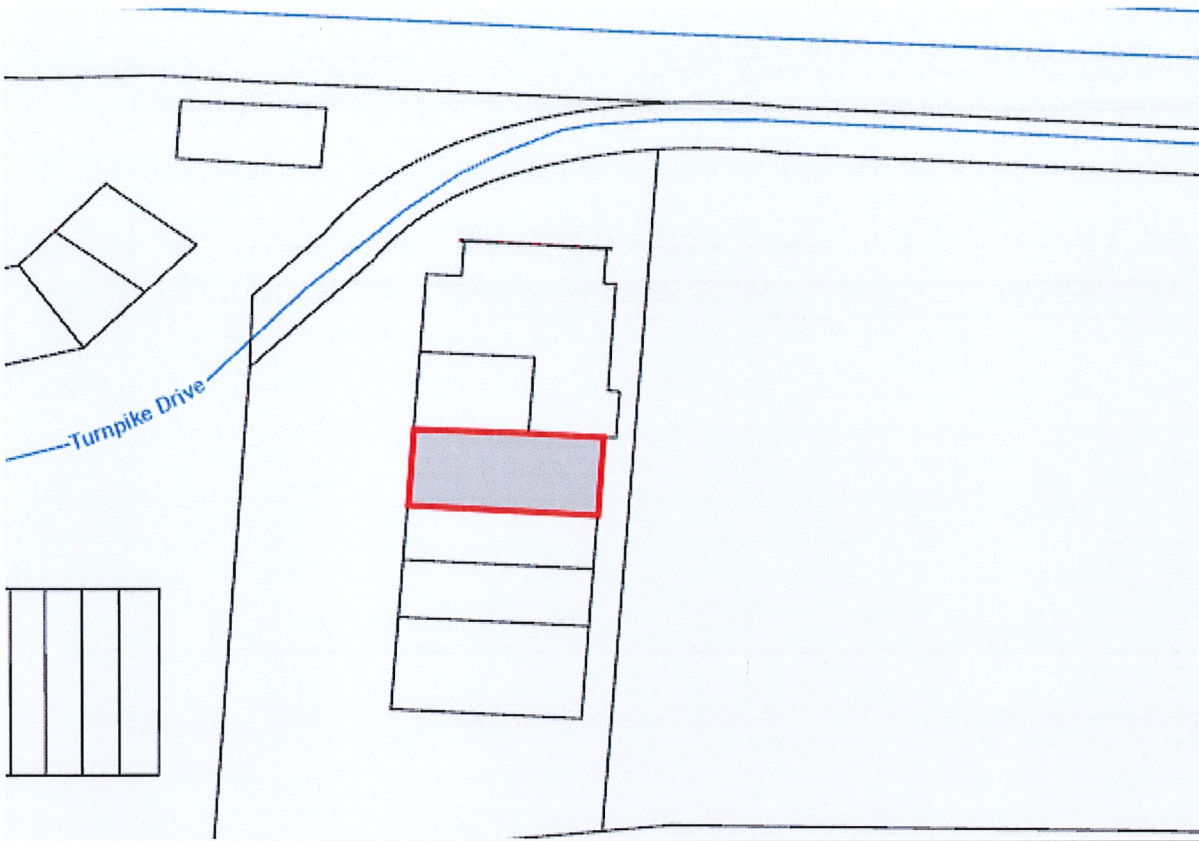
This summary memorandum regards an assessment appeal filed by the Upper Moreland School District. Our office has been contacted by the attorney representing the School District to propose a settlement of this pending appeal. This memorandum provides the Board of Commissioners with a summary of the pertinent information to evaluate and vote on a course of action.

I. PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

The property at issue is situated on 13,486 square feet, is identified as Parcel #59-00-17698-03-6 with address of 2800 Turnpike Drive, Upper Moreland Township, and is owned by Kahuna Holdings, LLC ("the Taxpayer"). This property is improved with an industrial building.

2800 Turnpike Drive





The School District filed an appeal for the property tax for the 2025 tax year. The assessed value for 2800 Turnpike Drive is \$296,520.00. Based upon the applicable Common Level Ratio, the implied market value is \$901,276.60 for tax year 2025 (CLR of 32.9%). In 2024, after the School District presented its evidence, the Board of Assessment Appeals issued a Notice of No Change in Assessment. The School District thereafter filed an appeal to the Court of Common Pleas.

II. PROPOSED SETTLEMENT

The proposed settlement negotiated between the Taxpayer and the School District is a fair market value of \$1,324,984.80 for tax year 2025. Applying the applicable Common Level Ratio, the assessed value would become \$435,920.00, resulting in an increase of the assessed value of \$139,400.00 for 2025.

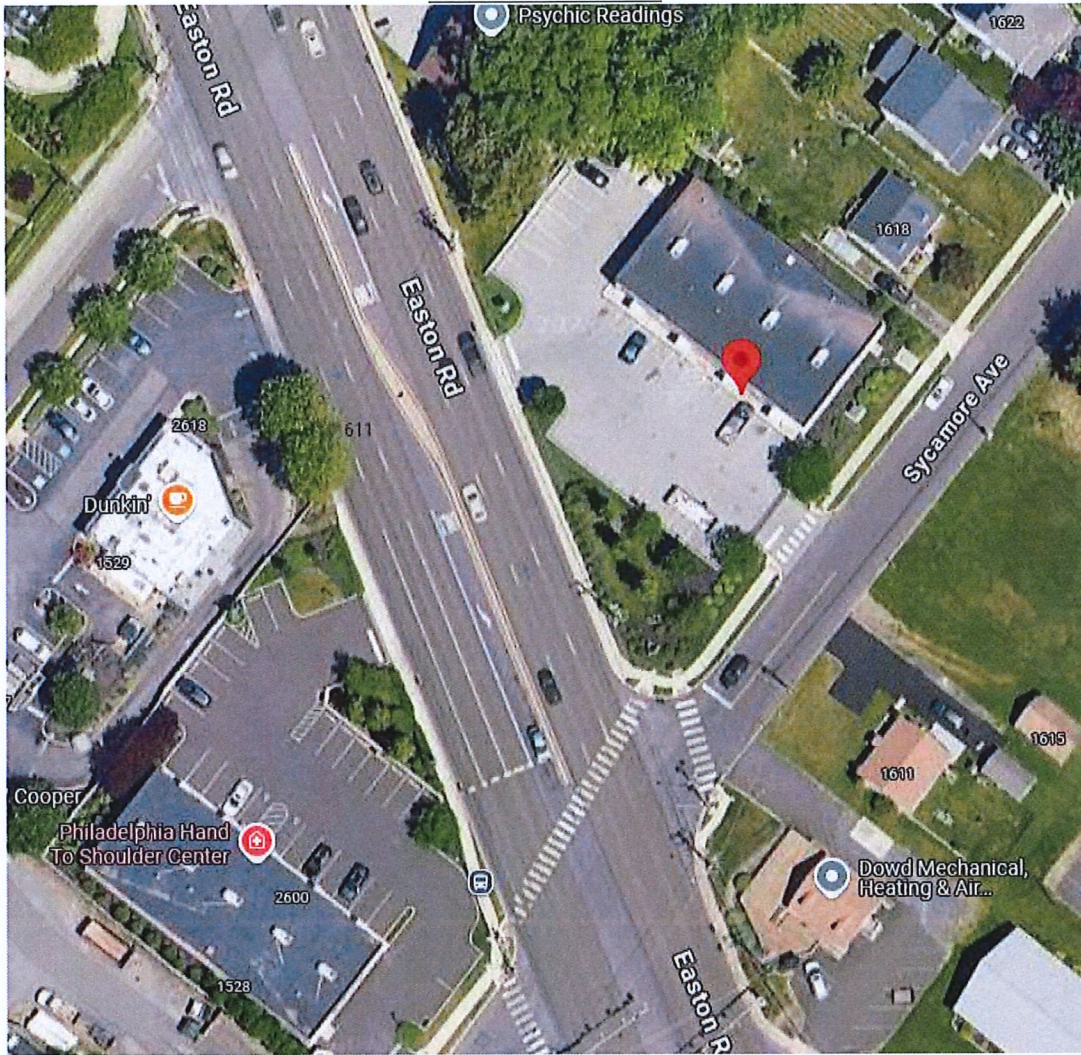

STIPULATION TO SETTLE

It is hereby stipulated by and between Justin D. Barbetta, Esquire, attorney for Upper Moreland School District, Appellant; Samantha A. Magee, Esquire, solicitor for the Montgomery County Board of Assessment Appeals, Appellee; Property Owner, Philadelphia Suburban Development Corp, by its attorney, George J. Ozorowski, Esquire, Brian O. Phillips, Esquire, Assistant County Solicitor for Montgomery County, and James Gallagher, Esquire, attorney for Upper Moreland Township, Intervenor, that the above-captioned assessment appeal is settled based upon the following agreements:

1. Effective January 1, 2025 for the Township and County and July 1, 2025 for the School District, the assessment for tax parcel number 59-00-05464-00-3, being 2607 Easton Road, Upper Moreland Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania (hereinafter the “Property”) shall be increased from Three Hundred Twelve Thousand, Five Hundred Fifty (312,550), which results in a Market Value of Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand (950,000) Dollars to Three Hundred Ninety Four Thousand, Eight Hundred (394,800), which results in a Market Value of One Million, Two Hundred Thousand (1,200,000) Dollars. This will be an increase in assessment of Eighty Two Thousand, Two Hundred Fifty (82,250).

2. Based upon the assessment established by this Stipulation to Settle, the taxing authorities may have received underpayments as follows:

3. The parties acknowledge that the above calculations are subject to verification by the appropriate representative of the respective taxing authority.

4. Property Owner shall pay the additional taxes due under this Stipulation pursuant to interim bills and/or invoices, which shall include a new two percent (2%) discount period and a ten percent (10%) penalty provision for late payments, issued by the taxing authorities reflecting such amounts.

5. The assessment for the Property shall remain 394,800 unless changed by reason of an assessment appeal, countywide reassessment, change in the Property, or otherwise as permitted by applicable law.

6. The parties acknowledge that this Stipulation to Settle does not in any way impair or restrict the Montgomery County Board of Assessment Appeals' statutory authority to revise the assessment of the subject parcel as a result of a countywide reassessment, change in the subject property, or otherwise as provided by applicable law.

7. The parties acknowledge that this Stipulation to Settle is a compromise of an existing matter. If there is any subsequent appeal filed by any party or successor in interest then the value agreed to herein is inadmissible in any other proceeding.

8. The parties acknowledge that each participant in this appeal shall bear their own costs and attorneys' fees.

9. The parties acknowledge and request that this appeal be marked settled, discontinued and ended upon Court approval of this Stipulation.

10. This Stipulation may be executed in one or more counterparts, all of which together shall be one instrument and all of which shall be considered duplicate originals. A signed faxed or PDF copy of this Stipulation shall have the same force and effect as the original signed Stipulation.
